House Trophy

Each year, we compete for the House Trophy. Students gain points for Turing House for good attendance, effort and achievement in their work and by contributing positively to the life of Robert Bloomfield Academy or by competing in one of the many inclusive House competitions run each year. Pupils can gain a House Recognition – worth 1 point, or a House Achievement – worth 3 points, to recognise particularly outstanding work or effort. Students can also be awarded a Principal's Recognition or a House Commendation, earning as many as 5 points.

There are also plenty of exciting and varied House competitions which are designed to cater to all interests and abilities – from Christmas Tree decorations to Dance and from Spring Sports to Bloomfield's Got Talent! At the end of each week in Form Time, we inform students of the running total of House points and any results of competitions within their form times, creating motivation for students to get as many House Points as possible to boost their House position.

House Captains

Each year we recruit House Captains in year 8 and they are given the responsibility of leading all of the form groups in their house, through the house system competitions and setting a positive example in terms of conduct and ethos.
