Topic Overview:		
In this project, you will explore the rainforest and discover the amazing plants and animals that live there. You will also learn about the primitive artist Henri Rousseau, who was inspired by jungles, exotic animals and the natural world. You will: - Create pencil studies of rainforest animals, carefully observing their shapes, details, patterns and textures. - Design and make a clay rainforest creature sitting on a leaf, using a range of clay making techniques. Once your sculpture has been fired, you will paint it, emphasising its details and textures. - Learn about zentangling and use fine-liner pens to create a detailed bug drawing inspired by the artist Rosalind Monks. - Learn the technique of scratch art and use it to create a detailed rainforest butterfly. Throughout the project, you will develop your observational drawing, sculpture, painting and mark-making skills, while exploring the amazing world of the rainforests and the art of Rousseau.
